





a spear, and at once there came out blood and wa-ter.



After this Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus,




but secretly, for fear of the Jews, asked --- Pilate that he might take

Jesus, and — bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the


burial custom of the Jews.
