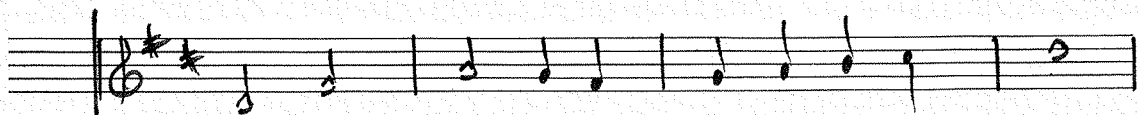
- 1 Hallelujah!

from the north and from the south.

- <sup>33</sup> The LORD changed rivers into deserts,\*  
and water-springs into thirsty ground,
- <sup>34</sup> a fruitful land into salt flats,\*  
because of the wickedness  
of those who dwell there.
- <sup>35</sup> He changed deserts into pools of water\*  
and dry land into water-springs.
- <sup>36</sup> He settled the hungry there,\*  
and they founded a city to dwell in.
- <sup>37</sup> They sowed fields,  
and planted vineyards,\*  
and brought in a fruitful harvest.
- <sup>38</sup> He blessed them,  
so that they increased greatly;\*  
he did not let their herds decrease.
- <sup>39</sup> Yet when they were diminished  
and brought low,\*  
through stress  
of adversity and sorrow,
- <sup>40</sup> he pours contempt on princes\*  
and makes them wander  
in trackless wastes;
- <sup>41</sup> he lifted up the poor out of misery\*  
and multiplied their families  
like flocks of sheep.
- <sup>42</sup> The upright will see this and rejoice,\*  
but all wickedness  
will shut its mouth.
- <sup>43</sup> Whoever is wise  
will ponder these things,\*  
and consider well  
the mercies of the LORD.

nor take the names of their gods
